6. FIRE CHIEF REPORT

A) Fire Incident Fire/Prevention Reports for March

Chief Henry called the District Board's attention to the summary report for the fire incident report for March and asked them if they had any questions. Chief Henry answered a question about the average response time graphs. There were no other questions.

B) COVID-19 Update

Chief Henry updated the District Board on the implementation of the District policies for COVID-19. He stated the District will apply for a grant that reimburses the District for expenses directly related to items purchased and staffing costs due to COVID-19.

C) Personnel Update

Chief Henry updated the District Board on the process and timeline scheduled for testing and the promotion for the three vacant Engineer positions. After these three positions are filled, the District will have five vacant firefighter positions to fill. The District has begun to plan a period of applications, a time for testing, and then going through the selection, interview and background checks for the five vacant firefighter positions.

D) Station 55 Parking Renovation Project

Chief Henry reported on the progress of the station 55 parking renovation project and some of the challenges the District has faced to date. The project is moving forward and is expected to be completed on time which is the third week of June.

E) Modular Classrooms

Chief Henry called the District Board's attention to the pictures in their board packets of the classroom being installed at District station 58. Due to school closures from COVID-19, the school district decided to move the classrooms sooner than originally scheduled. Fortunately, at station 58, the District was able

to receive the classroom and install it on short notice. Chief Henry stated at station 55, due to the ongoing parking renovation project, the classroom for station 55 is being staged near the School District's new District office until we are ready for placement sometime in June.

F) Emergency Generators

Chief Henry updated the District Board on the progress and the process of ordering and installing the generators for stations 57 and 58. This project requires a lot of steps and permits but is staring to move forward.

G) Weed Abatement

Chief Henry called the District Board's attention to the letter from Kerman City Manager John Jansons. At their April 8th meeting, the Kerman City Council approved transferring their weed abatement service to the District. This change has been in the works for a couple months and now the District will provide weed abatement services for the City of Kerman.

Chief Henry stated this is the time of year when a lot of Grants become available so the District will be looking to submit applications as these opportunities become available.

7. RESOLUTION NO. 20-05 AMENDING THE 2019-2020 FINAL BUDGET

A) Action item – Consider and adopt Resolution No. 20-05 amending the 2019-2020 final budget.

Mr. Barcelos called the District Board's attention to the memo in their board packet listing the items that need to be added to the budget by this amendment. Most of these items are capital purchases or improvements approved by the District Board during the fiscal year after the budget was adopted back in August 2019. The only item already in the budget that needs to be increased is the station 55 parking renovation project which is being increased because the bid came in over the proposed cost adopted in the budget.

Mr. Barcelos took the District Board through the list of capital purchases and improvements and described each one and the proposed cost approved by the Board. Mr. Barcelos explained the reasons for the increase in the station 55 parking renovation project.

Mr. Barcelos and Chief Henry answered a few questions from the District Board and addressed any concerns. After all the questions and comments, Mr. Abrahamian called for a motion



April Incident Summary














EMS/Rescue Call Types









SUBJECT: Grant Submission Updates

The following are Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) applications submitted in the past month with FEMA:

- Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER), 12 positions requested at \$3.1 million. Under normal circumstances FEMA covers 75% of the annual salary for the first two years and 35% in the third year. For those agencies that are awarded a SAFER grant this year, the Director of FEMA has committed 100% match for all three years with COVID funding.
- Assistance to Firefighters Grant COVID-19 Supplemental (AFG-S), PPE requested at \$84,438.48

The following grants have a 20% match funding requirement:

- Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Assistance to Firefighters Grants, Gear Washers
 \$93,848.60. This is a Regional grant request with Fresno County Fire Protection District. The grant will cover 2 protective clothing washing machines for NCF stations, 2 for FCO stations and 1 for the regional training center.
- Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Assistance to Firefighters Grants, Portable Radios
 \$233,429. This grant is intended to provide each member a portable radio while operating on an emergency incident.
- Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Assistance to Firefighters Grants, Vehicle acquisition \$196,900. This vehicle is similar to the current patrol unit and is intended to provide heavy rescue equipment throughout the District.

SUBJECT: District Audit Services Request for Proposal (RFP)

Assembly Bill 1345 added section 12410.6.(b) to the Government Code regarding auditor rotation requirements of public accounting firms providing audit services to local agencies.

Government Code section 12410.6.(b) indicates that commencing with the 2013-14 fiscal year, a local agency shall not employ a public accounting firm to provide audit services to a local agency if the lead audit partner or coordinating audit partner having primary responsibility for the audit, or the audit partner responsible for reviewing the audit, has performed audit services for that local agency for six consecutive fiscal years.

For purposes of calculating the six consecutive fiscal years, the local agency shall not consider any time that a public accounting firm was employed by that local agency prior to the 2013-14 fiscal year.

Mr. Sanborn has provided audit services to the District for six consecutive years. Per this Government Code Section, the District has to send out RFPs to prospective Auditing Firms for this year's audit. District staff will mail out the RFP to local audit firms experienced in conducting audit services for local government agencies. The submitted proposals will come back to the District Board for their review of the proposals and a new auditor for the District will be selected

NORTH CENTRAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AND CITY OF FRESNO AGREEMENT FOR AUTOMATIC AID FIRE SUPPRESSION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT FOR AUTOMATIC AID FIRE SUPPRESSION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (this "agreement") is made and entered into on the __ day of ______, 2020, by and between the CITY OF FRESNO, a California Charter City, hereinafter called "City" and NORTH CENTRAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter called "District."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the parties have the common power to provide fire protection services and desire to jointly exercise said power pursuant to the authority granted under Sections 6502 and 55632 of the California Government Code and Section 25400 et eq., of the California Health and Safety Code; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to maximize the delivery of fire suppression and emergency services by responding the closest unit necessary to protect life and property;

WHEREAS, an agreement to provide automatic aid is beneficial to both the District and the City; and

WHEREAS, the City does and the District anticipates that it will participate in the California Disaster and Civil Defense Master Mutual Aid Agreement with the State of California pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act for purposes of requesting mutual aid in connection with any incident which cannot be handled adequately by the party's respective fire department.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. <u>DEFINITIONS.</u>

Unless the particular provision or context otherwise requires, the definitions contained in this section shall govern the construction, meaning, and application of words used in this Agreement.

- a) <u>"Automatic Aid"</u> shall mean the immediate dispatch of a fire unit within the jurisdiction of the requesting party under pre-determined terms and conditions, using (NFPA) 1221 as a guideline.
- b) <u>"Automatic Aid Service Area"</u> shall mean the area within the Fresno City limits west of Highway 99 and extending beyond the City's corporate boundaries into the unincorporated areas serviced by the District (as identified in Exhibit B). An Automatic Aid Service Area map, attached to this <u>Aagreement</u> (Exhibit "B,") and incorporated herein by this reference, shall be regularly updated by the parties to this Agreement.

- c) "Nearest Available Fire Unit" shall mean the available fire apparatus of the appropriate type closest in dispatch and response time to the scene of the incident. Each fire apparatus shall be known as a "Fire Unit".
- d) <u>"Responding Party"</u> shall mean any party to this Agreement that receives a request for <u>F</u>fire <u>protection Protection S</u>services within the jurisdiction of the requesting party.
- e) "Requesting Party" shall mean any party to this Aagreement that requests fire protection or emergency services as defined by this Aagreement within its jurisdiction from the other party to this Aagreement.
- f) <u>"Emergency Medical Service"</u> shall mean life threatening (Priority 1) basic life support service, not including paramedic service.
- g) <u>"Emergency Response"</u> shall mean immediate response and use of red lights and siren by responding units.
- h) <u>"Fire Protection Services"</u> shall mean firefighting capacity to contain, control, and extinguish fires; the mitigation of fire-related hazards; and emergency medical services.
- i) <u>"Incident Commander"</u> shall mean the person in overall command at the incident as defined in the National Incident Management System, California Vehicle Code Sections 2453 and 2454, or by such other agreement as provided by law.
- j) <u>"Standard Response Plan"</u> shall mean the pre-designated number and type of apparatus that routinely respond to a specific type of emergency incident.
- k) "Mutual Aid" shall mean request of resources based on the needs determined by the managers of the incident and subject to authorization by the responding party for each request.

SECTION 2. <u>FURNISHING OF FIRE SUPPRESSION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES.</u>

<u>Purpose:</u> By entering into this Agreement, the parties desire to enhance their abilities to provide fire suppression and emergency services by sharing resources when and where appropriate for emergency incident mitigation. To effectuate this purpose, the parties agree that their respective agencies will respond with their nearest available <u>City</u> Fire Unit(s) within the attached defined Automatic Aid Service Area (Exhibit "B"). The <u>District will respond with their nearest available District Fire Unit(s) to any City jurisdiction on State Route 99 or west thereof</u>. Neither agency is required to respond with particular identified units, however, the nearest available Fire Unit response concept shall be utilized when appropriate as it represents the foundation and rationale for this Agreement.

a) Service Details Determined by Fire Chiefs. The specific details of providing the services under the terms as specified in this Agreement shall be determined by the respective Fire Chiefs of the parties. It is understood that all plans pertaining to the Fire Protection Services shall adhere as closely as practical to the "Nearest Available Fire Unit" concept which forms the basis for this Agreement.

- b) <u>District Obligations to City</u>. The District agrees to provide the following to the City:
 - (1) Upon request of the City, to respond with no less than one Fire Unit as Automatic Aid within the Automatic Aid Service Area to any emergency incident(s), excluding lower priority medical calls, to complete alarm assignments as defined by the requesting party's response matrix. The responding Fire Unit will include at least three (3) career fire personnel on ladder truck(s) / fire engines and at least two (2) career staff on squad(s) or the equivalent. Any response vehicle with staffing of two will not be counted as part of the response matrix for the initial response to fire calls but may be considered as a resource to utilize during the initial attack and during overhaul.
 - (2) Upon request of the City, to respond with one Fire Unit as Automatic Aid within the Automatic Aid Service Area to Priority 1 Emergency Medical Service calls only. If any two-person response vehicle responds to the following Priority 1 Emergency Medical Service calls; Cardiac Arrest/Non-Breather, Gunshot or Stabbing, and Motor Vehicle Accident (MVA), the closest additional Fire unit will also be dispatched. Should the City upgrade its standard medical call responses to include Priority 2 calls in the future, the District agrees to respond to these lower priority calls contingent upon the City reciprocating with the same on behalf of the District. This service is provided at no cost.
 - (3) Upon request of the City, the District will provide one water tender in addition to any previously assigned automatic aid resources.
 - (4) Upon request of the City, the District will provide one Fire Unit with 3 career staff to cover the area within the City limits, in support of draw down caused by emergency activity. This is a general agreement of intent and does not obligate the District if its resources are unavailable.
 - (5) Any requests for assistance outside of the areas established or not identified herein shall be considered a Mutual Aid request as identified in the recitals and would be subject to authorization by the responding party for each request based on availability rather than the nearest available concept.
- c) <u>City Obligations to the District</u>. The City agrees to provide the following to the District:
 - (1) Upon request of District, to respond with no less than one Fire Unit as Automatic Aid within the Automatic Aid Service Area to any emergency incident(s), excluding lower priority calls, to complete alarm assignments as defined by the requesting party's response matrix. The responding Fire Unit will include at least three (3) career fire personnel.

- (2) Upon request of the District to respond with one Fire Unit as Automatic Aid within the Automatic Aid Service Area to Priority 1 Emergency Medical Service calls only.
- (3) Any requests for assistance outside of the areas established or not identified herein would be considered a Mutual Aid Request and would be subject to authorization by the responding party for each request based on availability rather than the nearest available concept.

SECTION 3. OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE DISTRICT AND THE CITY.

The District and the City agree to the following additional responsibilities and obligations:

- a) Radio Frequencies. Fire Units responding to Automatic Aid requests will utilize the radio frequencies assigned by the requesting party.
- b) <u>First Units</u>. The first unit to arrive at the scene of the incident shall initiate appropriate action. The officer-in-charge of the first unit to arrive shall cause to be reported to the requesting party all pertinent information about the conditions encountered at the scene of the incident.
- Officer in Charge. The officer-in-charge of the first arriving unit shall be in charge of the incident until command is transferred to an officer of the requesting party. All apparatus at the scene of an emergency will be under the command of the Incident Commander ("IC"). The first arriving chief officer, regardless of jurisdiction, may assume command until relieved by a chief officer of the agency having jurisdictional responsibility. Every effort will be made to operate as a single attack force rather than separate agencies.
- d) <u>Incident Commander</u>. If an IC requires additional resources to augment the emergency response, they shall order them through the jurisdictional agency dispatch center of the agency having jurisdictional responsibility. There will always be one ordering point for any incident, and this will be determined by the agency which has jurisdictional authority for the incident.
- e) <u>Early Release of Resources</u>. Both parties agree to release the other agency's resources as quickly as operationally feasible to limit commitment times.
- f) <u>Incident Command System.</u> The incident Command System (ICS) shall be used on every incident.
- g) Availability of Equipment. Neither party to this Agreement is obligated to furnish any services to the requesting party if, in the sole discretion of the Fire Chief or their designee, the apparatus, equipment, personnel, or any combination thereof, is not available.
- h) <u>Mutual Training</u>. The parties shall conduct mutual trainings to ensure employees are familiar with protocols and equipment utilized by the other and are aligned with operational area policies.
- i) Common Radio Communications. The parties shall work cooperatively to develop and maintain common radio communications protocols to assure adequate communications exist while jointly responding to emergency incidents. In addition, work cooperatively and actively to deploy dispatching methods and Automatic Vehicle Location (AVL) tracking capabilities to improve response times, reduce unnecessary delays, and provide for accountability. Specifically, both agencies will support the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) interagency interface (CAD to CAD) system in conjunction with live AVL data exchange to ensure the closest unit is recommended and utilized without unnecessary delays and develop specific operating

procedures that ensure dispatching accuracy.

- j) <u>Notifications</u>. When advised of an emergency incident within the other's jurisdiction, each party will make immediate notification of the incident to the jurisdictional agency.
- k) <u>Protective Equipment</u>. Ensure that all personnel respond in and use proper personal protective equipment (PPE) as specified by the policies of the respective parties.

SECTION 4. PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES.

The provisions of this agreement are intended to comply with the provisions of Article 2, Chapter 2, Part 1, Division 12, of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California, and Article 2, Chapter 4, Part 2, Division 2, Title 5, of the Government Code of the State of California, providing for privileges and immunities from liabilities, exemption from losses, and rules applicable to personnel furnishing fire protection outside the jurisdiction of the responding party and within the jurisdiction of the requesting party.

SECTION 5. MUTUAL INDEMNIFICATION.

The District, to the extent permitted by law, agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents and employees from any and all economic losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by the District in the performance of any activities under this agreement, except where such injury or damage arose from the sole negligence or willful misconduct attributable to the City or from acts not within the scope of duties to be performed pursuant to this Aagreement.

The City, to the extent permitted by law, agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the District, its officers, agents and employees from any and all economic losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by the City in the performance of any activities under this Agreement, except where such injury or damage arose from the sole negligence or willful misconduct attributable to the District or from acts no within the scope of duties to be performed pursuant to this Agreement.

SECTION 6. AGENCY.

It is the intent of the parties hereto, and part of the consideration supporting this Aagreement, that each party shall bear all risks and obligations for its own personnel (including, but not limited to, State and Federal Training Mandates as required for California firefighters, pension, relief, disability, worker's compensation, and other benefits) as well as injury or damage to third parties that may arise while responding to the requesting party's incident in the same manner and to the same extent as if occurring within responding party's jurisdiction, subject only to Section 3 herein.

SECTION 7. THIRD PARTIES.

This <u>Aagreement</u> shall not be construed as or deemed an <u>Aagreement</u> for the benefit of any third party or parties, and no third party or parties shall have any right of action hereunder for any cause whatsoever.

SECTION 8. <u>ASSIGNMENT.</u>

This <u>Aagreement</u> shall be binding on the successors and assignees of the parties hereto, except that no party shall assign this <u>Aagreement</u> without the prior written consent of the other party.

SECTION 9. <u>ADMINISTRATION OF AGREEMENT.</u>

This Aagreement shall be administered through the mutual agreement of the parties acting by and through their respective Fire Chiefs or designees.

SECTION 10. <u>TERM AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT.</u>

This agreement Agreement	may be terminated by either party as to its rights and obligations	under

SUBJECT: Weed Abatement Public Hearing and Notices

The first public hearing for the weed abatement season is scheduled for tonight.

District engine companies inspected a little over 400 lots in the first week of May. The lots inspected were the properties and areas in the District repeatedly in violation of the District abatement program in the past few years. During the inspections, several more lots in the District were discovered that need abatement. Of the lots inspected and discovered during the inspections, 241 were not abated and received a "Notice to Destroy Weeds." Last year at this time 114 notices were mailed out. The notices were mailed to property owners on May 11th through the 15th.

After the public hearing being held tonight, engine companies will begin to re-inspect the lots receiving notices. Lots not abated will be assigned to the District's abatement contractor to abate, and the charges will be added to the tax roll by resolution adopted by the Board in July.

Attached is a list of the properties receiving the "Notice to Destroy Weeds" for review by the Board.
